#### A thematic unit of instruction should include:

- Alignment with curriculum standards or benchmarks
- Instructional Goals and Skills/Objectives
- Interdisciplinary content (multiple subject areas)
- Connects topics under an umbrella of one theme
- Multiple lessons (duration well beyond just one class period)
